You will get plenty of practice and training on essential competencies including maneuvering a boat under sail and power, passage preparation, safety underway, docking, navigation, and adherence to regulatory requirements.

- Course cost two participants: Six days, five nights \$4,530
- Additional participants \$590 each (maximum of four aboard)

A recommended gear list will be provided to participants prior to departure.

Paper charts, handbearing compass, navigation equipment, all the required safety gear, including lifejackets, will be provided for use during the course, however you ae welcome to bring your own.

You provide your own provisions for all meals, you may eat ashore at the local yacht club on instruction days. Cookware, tableware, and good drinking water aboard.
